The proposal is designed by Leslie Jones Architecture, an award-winning architectural practice with a long history of retail development.




ABOUT THE GLADES

Originally opened in 1991, The Glades has been a significant employer within the community, hosting approximately 135 shops.

Since the closure of the Debenhams unit in 2021, this part of the shopping centre has remained vacant, creating a noticeable gap. We acknowledge that this area currently does not attract high levels of footfall. However, these proposal aims to rejuvenate this part of the shopping centre.

The proposal will revitalise the centre, reconnecting Elmfield Road to the town centre and attracting further investment to this area.





THE PROPOSAL

The former Debenhams unit, which spans four levels (including one level for storage), will be divided into three separate stores, each occupying a different level within the shopping centre. These new units will comprise major retailers and leisure operators.




This proposal presents an opportunity for the centre to contribute towards Bromley's night-time economy, with leisure offers having extended opening hours.

Additionally, the proposal includes public realm improvements along Elmfield Road. The introduction of green spaces and seating will enhance the area, providing a pleasant environment for those waiting for public transport and making better use of currently under used space.

KEY BENEFITS

This proposal offers numerous benefits for The Glades and the wider Bromley area, including:

- Bringing a long-standing and large vacant retail unit back into operation
- Introducing attractive, major retail and leisure operators
- Improving the public realm on Elmfield Road to create new green spaces for shoppers to enjoy
